Patron Code of Conduct

Welcome to the Uinta County Library. For the comfort and safety of all library patrons, all library users must adhere to the following library policies. The spirit of these policies is to ensure a pleasant and safe environment for library users and staff.

Acceptable Behavior

Library users are expected to conduct themselves in a matter that does not violate the rights of others, and does not result in the loss or damage of property. The Uinta County Library encourages the following behaviors within the library:

- Respect of other users' rights of access – both physically and intellectually – to the library
- Appropriate use of library materials, equipment and property
- Patron responsibility and respect for personal property
- Appropriate public attire, including shoes and shirts
- Parental responsibility for the behavior of their children

Unacceptable Behavior

The Uinta County Library considers the following behaviors to be unacceptable within the library:

- Physically assaulting or molesting any library user or staff
- Using abusive, lewd, or obscene language toward any library user or staff
- Engaging in disorderly conduct, unreasonably disturbing or offending library users or staff
- Exhibiting threatening, intimidating or aggressive behavior
- Possession of illegal weapons
- Destroying of library property or personal property
- Stealing of library property or personal property
- Consuming alcohol or illicit substances
- Running, jumping and the use of athletic equipment such as skateboards, rollerblades and balls
- Entering with animals, other than service animals that assist patrons with disabilities
- Use of personal audio or communication devices so that others can hear
- Unauthorized entrance to non-public areas of the library
- Engaging in any illegal activity not otherwise listed

Failure to comply with the library's policies could result in removal from the premises, restriction of library privileges, arrest or prosecution.
